**GUEST: Ellesor Holder** presented the LMG Board a check for \$500 for the Master Gardeners' work on the topiary exhibit. She also presented the Board with a numbered Festival of Flowers 2011 print by Jeffrey Callaham. It will be framed to hang in the Master Gardener office. She asked for Master Gardeners to complete the survey on the Festival website to provide feedback about the Festival. There will be a consultant to tabulate the results of the survey at the end of August. Ellesor asked if anyone was interested in heading the topiary project next year because Kathryn Smith is stepping down. Dwight Long also will be limiting his involvement next year. Ellesor indicated that the position would be paid something.

Subsequent to Ellesor's departure, it was determined that the Board would assess Master Gardener involvement at a meeting in September open to the General Membership. -See article page 3-
